#### WHERE HAVE ALL THE SUNSPOTS GONE?

Things aren't looking that good for 10 Meters on Field Day. Cycle 24 is entering the end of its cycle and the sunspot number is diving. Cycle 24 may turn out to be the lowest cycle since accurate records were started to be kept in 1750 and things aren't looking any better for Cycle 25. Some of the experts are predicting that Cycle 25 will only be half as strong as 24. Cycle 24 is strange in another way, it was double peaked. Double peaked cycles are not that uncommon but Cycle 24's second peak was stronger than the first which was unheard of. The first peak occurred in 2011 with a smoothed sunspot number of 99. The second peak was in 2014 with a SSN of 101.

If we look at a three month moving average of sunspot numbers centered on February of this year it is 49. That is the lowest since January of 2011 when it was 35.3. It's only getting worse. Last week the daily sunspot number dropped from 28.1 the previous week to 19.4. The big factor in the drop was that the daily sunspot number was 11 on March 31, April 1 and April 2. This is the lowest sunspot number possible unless there are no sunspots then it would be 0. Each sunspot group is counted as 10 points then the number of sunspots in that group counted as one each is added to the group, so a number of 11 means that there was just one group with one sunspot in it. Cycle 24 started on January 4, 2008 so if Cycle 24 holds to anywhere near the standard 11 year cycle we should see the start of Cycle 25 in about 3 years.

#### HAMMING IT UP IN THE MILITARY

After the February meeting Bill Hudzik W2UDT and I were talking to some of the visitors when he mentioned that he had been stationed at Kadena Air Force Base on Okinawa. When I asked him when, he replied 1966 to 1968. That's when I told him that in 1967 I was twelve air miles to the south of Kadena stationed at a Army Base in Naha next to the Air Force Base that was shared with the Navy, Marines and the Civil Air Terminal. For a year Bill was the operator at a Ham station at Kadena KR6SP that ran phone patches back home. I had been asked to do the same at KR6USA the 2<sup>nd</sup> Logistics Command Headquarters station at Fort Buckner which was about half way between us but, because I was only a Technician at the time I had to turn the position down. I still have the license that I was issued to be able to operate any station in the Ryukyu Islands with the station owners permission. Technicians were able to operate on 10 meter phone in that zone. Unfortunately we were at the bottom of a solar cycle just starting into cycle 20 so 10 was not


